

Short Bio – Domingos Farinho

Domingos Farinho is an Assistant Professor at the University of Lisbon School of Law. He is also a Senior Researcher of the Lisbon Public Law research centre where he coordinates the Lisbon Digital Rights research group. His main areas of research are Administrative Law (especially EU and national Regulatory Law), Fundamental Rights (mainly Privacy, Data Protection, and Online Platforms), and Legal Theory. He is also a legal consultant working in the field of Administrative Law and Regulation. He has been especially interested in fundamental rights in the context of Public Administrations and Cyberspace. He has coordinated and participated in several courses regarding Data Protection, the GDPR and access to State-held information. He has written extensively on these topics.
